Engaging with Science



In our continuous effort to make our teaching learning process more interesting and engaging, The Future Foundation School has collaborated with Birla Industrial and Technological Museum (BITM), Kolkata. Students of Classes V to VII visited BITM to attend some special classes on June 20 - 22, 2016, as part of a series of such educational visits. The visit was aimed at offering an opportunity to develop a scientific temper and attitudes that are important in studying science, such as curiosity, critical thinking, creativity, cooperation, perseverance, sensitivity to the environment, etc.






The classes dealt with various interesting topics in EVS (Class V), Physics, Chemistry, Mathematics and Geography. The Education Officers and the resource team made the process of learning very interactive and the topics were covered through hands - on activities, experiments, lecture demonstration sessions, audio visual presentations, etc. The students spent an entire day working on exploring the various concepts which are part of their curriculum. They got an opportunity to experience and work on certain fundamental concepts through thought provoking presentations on the 'Story of the Atom', 'The Power of 10', etc and through some dynamic experiments like, 'The emission of Cathode Ray, Rising of Foam', 'Chemiluminescence', 'Traffic Light Reaction' etc. They solved problems related to 'Pascal's Triangle', 'Simple 'Machines', 'Measurement', 'Solar System', 'Geographical Location' etc and did role plays to simulate the earth's movements, etc, to name a few.





World Yoga Day





International Day of Yoga commonly and unofficially referred to as Yoga Day, is celebrated annually on June 21 since its inception in 2015. An International Day for Yoga was declared by the United Nations General Assembly (UNGA) on December 11, 2014, almost unanimously. Yoga is a physical, mental and spiritual practice attributed mostly to India. The Indian Prime Minister Narendra Modi in his UN Address suggested the date of June 21, as it is the longest day of the year in the Northern Hemisphere and shares special significance in many parts of the world. The idea of an International Day of Yoga was first proposed by him during his speech at the UNGA, on September 27, 2014

We celebrated Yoga Day in our School by putting up yoga performances by students of Classes I to VIII in Special Assemblies. Children of Classes I to IV displayed postures of Yogasana along with the 'Yog Geet' that was released on June 21, 2016 in connection with the celebration of the second International Day of Yoga. Students of Classes V to VIII came up with another set of yoga postures including pyramids and explained their benefits. A message was read out, highlighting the significance of this day.

Sweet Home



Sikkim Excursion - Class XI
